



Public Information Meeting: Green Line Extension to Mystic Valley Parkway Preliminary Environmental Review

On October 17, 2017, the MBTA filed a Notice of Project Change (NPC) for the Green Line Extension Project with the Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs (EEA). The NPC was noticed in the November 8, 2017 edition of the [Environmental Monitor](#).

MassDOT and the MBTA are holding a community meeting on this NPC. The community meeting will be an opportunity to provide information to the public on the NPC and on the environmental review process. The community meeting on the NPC will be:
